***Answers to the questions from the interested suppliers
in competitive procedure with negotiation

RB Rail AS presents the following answers to the questions received until 28 April, 2017 from the interested suppliers:

No	Question	Answer
1.	Unfortunately, we struggle with the reference for the "cross-boarder" project in EU. Simply, because they are not that many. I believe that also other Candidates might have the same problem, therefore I wanted to ask you whether it would be possible to relax the requirements listed in the paragraph 3.4.5. of the Regulations.	The procurement commission is not planning to make amendments on the Regulations, therefore to comply with a requirement set in the Clause 3.9.9. of the Regulations, in order to verify compliance with the selection criteria set out in paragraphs 3.6.1 - 3.6.2 of the Regulations, the Candidate shall provide information in form "Experience of the Project Manager" (Annex No. 4), and submit at least one written reference or statement (for each of the selection criteria set out in paragraphs 3.6.1 - 3.6.2 of the Regulations) from the Project Manager's previous customers confirming the accuracy and correctness of information provided by the Candidate.
2.	If we are planning to involve a subcontractor, do we have to submit agreement about works, that we will hand over to the subcontractors?	According to the Clause 3.11. of Regulations, Candidate, in order to comply with the selection criteria set out in the Regulations, has a possibility to rely on the capacity or means of other persons or subcontractors. In this case the Candidate shall also submit any of the following documents in order to prove that the qualification of the Candidate meets the qualification requirements set out in the Regulations: an agreement with a subcontractor, the confirmation of the subcontractor or any other evidence (proof) on availability of the necessary resources at the disposal of the Candidate.
