Rail Baltica project progress

- Completion of the Rail Baltica mainline design continues, construction works ongoing
- Control-Command and Signalling Engineering and Works Supervision contract signed
- Design and design supervision services for the construction of „Kaunas – Vilnius” section procurement launched
- Contract for the construction of Neris bridge in Lithuania signed
- Procurement launched for the construction of the Rail Baltica Ülemiste joint terminal and its surrounding area
- Rail Baltica mainline procurement in Latvia approaching the 2nd stage
- Extra financing for priority activities in Latvia and Lithuania from the EU Military Mobility allocation of CEF received



Procurement plan for 2022 launched with the total contract amount exceeding 2 billion EUR

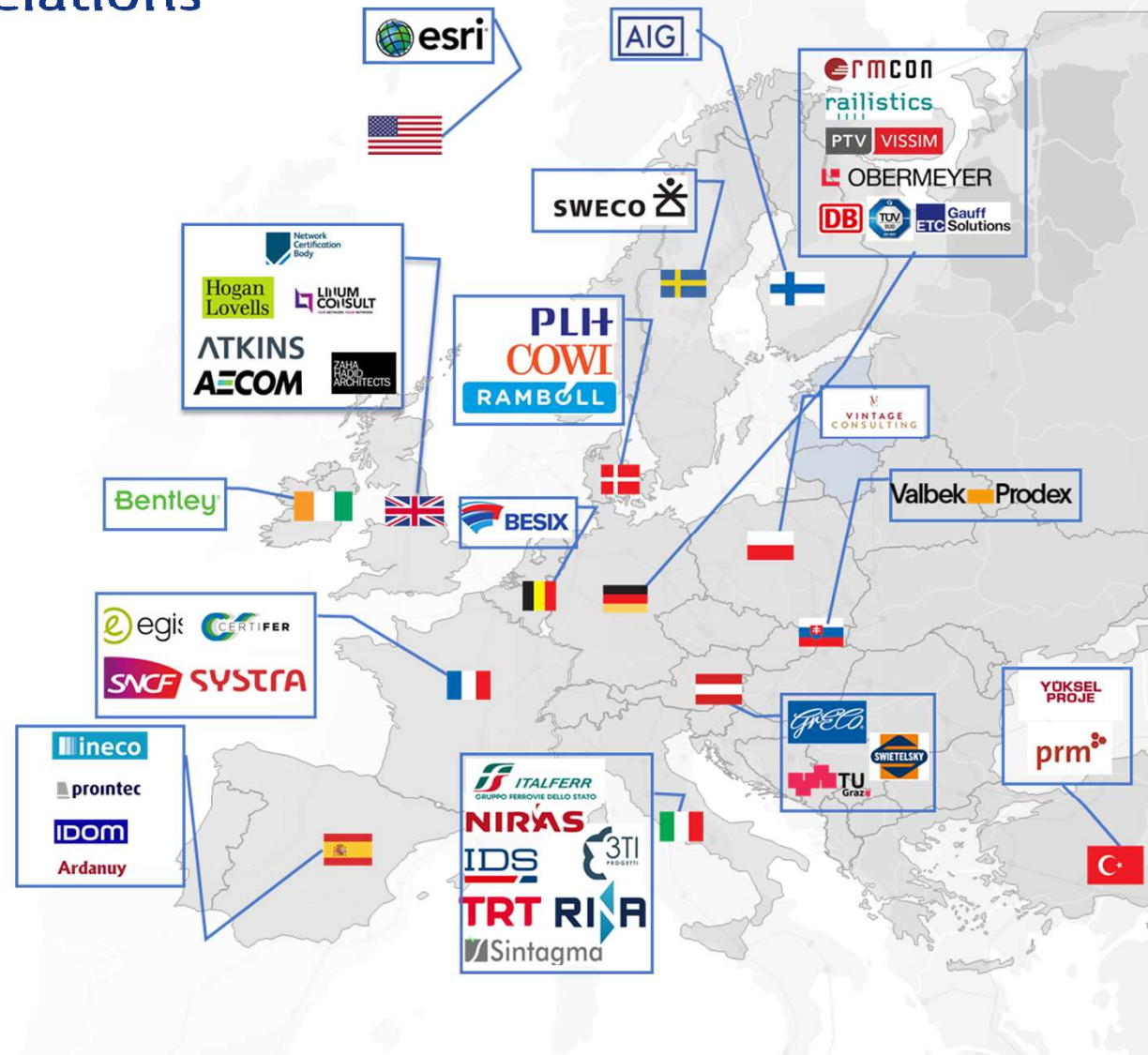
Strong partner and supplier relations – one of our top priorities
