










- On section Kaunas LT/PL border the new alignement chosen, design works to commence in 2023, also for Kaunas – Vilnius
- First phase of construction works ongoing in all countries, preparation for large scale constructions ongoing
- Progress with local facilities' development infrastructure manintenance facilities, freight and passenger terminals, regional stations etc.
- Electrification deployment strategy selected and Electrification Design and build procurement launched, 4 applications received in 1st phase
- Control-Command and Signalling Engineer selected, work on deployment strategy started
- Consolidated construction material procurements proceeding with 2nd phase
- Military Mobility financing attracted to individual project elements
- Procurement plan 2022 with total contract value exceeding EUR 2 billion published









Global project strategic elements

- Role and strategic importance of Rail Baltica getting stronger an obligation to build
- Rail Baltica not only as an economic, but also defence corridor
- North Sea Baltic core network now includes also Kyiv and Mariupole
- Phased implementation 2024/2027/2030. 1435 mm corridor connecting Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania with rest of Single Railway Area in place by 2030
- Increased cooperation with Poland and Finland, increased best practice exchange with other large scale development projects
- Preparing for railway operations (infrastructure management, rolling stock, development of services etc.). Shadow operator chosen








Strong partner and supplier relations

- Rail Baltica Global forum April 2023










